ZONING –

Macon County Board Resolution Regarding Case S-01-03-18, A Petition Requesting a Special Use Permit Submitted by Keith & Diane Jenkins

Ms. Gunter explained that this is to allow a secondary residence where a primary residence already exists in a R-1 single family residential zoning. The property is commonly located at 999 Tohill Road in South Wheatland Township. On March 7, a public Zoning Board of Appeals hearing was held and based on the finding of facts, staff recommends approval. The ZBA voted 5-0 for approval with stipulation found in the resolution.

Mr. Potts made a motion to approve forwarding to the full County Board with recommendation to approve, seconded by Ms. Zimmerman, and the motion carried 5-0.

SUBDIVISIONS –

2 Lot Minor – G. F. Lynch Disposal Addition

Ms. Gunter reported that this is a 2 lot minor subdivision located in Harristown Township. The owners are Mr. Frank Lynch for the estate of Glen Lynch. It is located at 4411 W. Cantrell and is zoned as R-4 single family residential. Lot one is 2.99 acres and lot 2 is 3.41 acres for a total

of 6.4 acres. The City of Decatur has approved the subdivision. Staff has reviewed all documents and recommends approval.

She explained that they could help with rent, power bills, food cards, or bus passes.
