WHEREAS, the Health Department has just received notification of the Maternal Infant Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program changing its process for providing mental health consultation services to MIECHV staff;

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Human Services will increase the MIECHV grant award to cover these services; and

WHEREAS, the grant funders have adjusted the process for providing these services by now offering as a contract with a consultant; and

WHEREAS, provision for this grant, beginning July 1, 2021, was not included in the FY 21 budget: and

WHEREAS, unforeseen circumstances have arisen which give rise to an emergency situation in that valuable services will be compromised if this contract is not executed; and

WHEREAS, these consultation services will provide reflective consultation to Agency Administrator(s) to provide the opportunity for the administrator(s) to reflect on their role and impact of their work; and

WHEREAS, Provide reflective consultation to Agency MIECHV Supervisor(s) to provide the opportunity for the supervisor(s) to reflect on their role as well as to support the supervisor(s) to problem solve, plan, and process concerns that arise when supporting staff in the navigation of working with families, and when issues of social and emotional well-being arise; and

WHEREAS, Provide group reflective consultation with supervisor(s) and staff present to reflect on their work with families; and

WHEREAS, Provide reflective consultation, in collaboration with the supervisor(s) present, during individual staff reflective supervision; and

WHEREAS, Provide, prepare, and create ongoing professional development trainings for MIECHV-specified trainings in the context of reflective consultation.

WHEREAS the contract was discussed and approved by the Macon County Board of Health on March 16, 2021, the Macon County EEHW committee discussed and approved this contract on March 25, 2021, and the Finance Committee discussed and recommended approval of this contract on March 29, 2021; and

THIS AGREEMENT for services ("**Agreement**") is made as of the first day of July 2021, by and between

Macon County Health Department

(Agency)

Hereinafter Known as

"Agency"

and

(Consultant)

Hereinafter Known as

"Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant"

Funding:

Funding for the Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant is from the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration, through the Illinois Department of Human Services - Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program.

Term:

The term for this Agreement is **July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022**, unless amended in writing by mutual agreement of the parties.

Compensation and Reimbursement of Services:

The total dollar amount of this contract is not to exceed **\$14,400** for the duration of the contract. In consideration of the services to be rendered, the sums to be paid, and each and every covenant and condition contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

The Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant shall submit an invoice to the Agency by the 1st of each month detailing the activities undertaken the previous month. In exchange for providing Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation, the Agency will make **monthly** payments at a rate of \$150/hour to the Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant within 30 days of the start of each month. This rate includes all travel time, mileage, and expenses incurred by the Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant. Considering the maximum total dollar amount and the hourly rate, the Infant/Early Childhood Consultant may bill up to 96 hours of Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation per state fiscal year.

Description of Services:

The services of the Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant will be performed in a professional quality and manner, and can occur in-person, virtually or via conference call, based on a mutual agreement by both parties. Deliverables include the items listed below, following the Illinois Model of Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation.

A. Provide reflective consultation to Agency Administrator(s) to provide the opportunity for the administrator(s) to reflect on their role and impact of their work.

B. Provide reflective consultation to Agency MIECHV Supervisor(s) to provide the opportunity for the supervisor(s) to reflect on their role as well as to support the supervisor(s) to problem solve, plan, and process concerns that arise when supporting staff in the navigation of working with families, and when issues of social and emotional well-being arise.

C. Provide group reflective consultation with supervisor(s) and staff present to reflect on their work with families.

D. Provide reflective consultation, in collaboration with the supervisor(s) present, during individual staff reflective supervision.

E. Provide, prepare, and create ongoing professional development trainings for MIECHV-specified trainings in the context of reflective consultation. Trainings provided may include: Futures without Violence: "Healthy Moms – Happy Babies 3rd Edition: An Evidence-Based Approach to Addressing Domestic Violence In Home Visitation and Perinatal Case Management Programs"; The 4 Ps Plus (Parents, Partners, Past and Pregnancy); the Edinburgh Postnatal Depression Scale; the Hurt-Insult-Threaten-Scream Screening Tool for Male Caregivers; Mothers and Babies Maternal Depression Prevention Curriculum; "I Can Parent, Too: Learn Strategies for Supporting the Inclusion of All Parents in Home Visits; and Racial Equity. Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultants will offer Gateway credits through the Gateways to Opportunities – Illinois Professional Development System for these professional development activities and agree to notify the Consultation Coordinator to initiate the process of Gateway approval. The Coordinator will complete the necessary processes for the Gateway system, forward the attendance and evaluation forms, and enter the participants in Gateway after successful completion of participation.

F. Complete quarterly report for Periodic Performance Report that includes a summary of consultation activities as specified in the deliverables of the contract with the Illinois Department of Human Services.

G. Participate monthly in Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant Reflective Learning Group.

H. Participate in MIECHV Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant Group Reflective Meetings

I. Participate in individual reflective consultation with MIECHV Consultation

Coordinator.

Exclusion of Agency and Employment and Cancellation Clause:

The Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant and the Agency shall remain separate and independent entities. None of the provisions of the Agreement are intended to create, nor shall be deemed or construed to create any relationship between or among the parties other than that of independent contractors. If said Agency cancels a scheduled Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation 48 hours or less than the agreed upon date/time, the Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant is given the right to bill said Agency for the total amount of consultation scheduled for the date of cancellation.

Termination Clause:

- A. Either party hereto may terminate this Agreement (with or without cause) with two (2) weeks written notice provided to the other party.
- B. If this Agreement is terminated by Agency for any reason prior to the completion of all work or the termination date of this Agreement, Agency agrees to pay actual, allowable, allocable, and reasonable charges and applicable costs incurred up to the date of termination, but not to exceed the firm, fixed price of this Agreement.
- C. The notice of cancellation shall terminate this Agreement immediately and Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant shall cease any work commenced or in progress upon receipt of notice sent by the Agency.
- D. Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant shall submit a final invoice to the Agency for review and approval within fifteen days (15) after the written notice of cancellation has been received by either party. Agency shall pay Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant's outstanding and due balance of all submitted and approved invoices and that portion of the period immediately prior to the cancellation including all unpaid approved expenses incurred by the Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant.

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois and all applicable federal laws, regulations, and policies.





7. This agreement shall be in full force and effect upon its approval by the Mount Zion Township Road District and the Macon County Board, and shall inure to the benefit of the Mount Zion Township Road District, its successors and assigns, and the Macon County Board, until the roadway improvements are completed and all related costs therefore are paid or the project is cancelled.

THIS AGREEMENT IS MADE between the above Local Public Agency (LPA) and Consultant (ENGINEER) and covers certain professional engineering services in connection with the improvement of the above SECTION. Project funding allotted to the LPA by the State of Illinois under the general supervision of the State Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "DEPARTMENT," will be used entirely or in part to finance ENGINEERING services as described under AGREEMENT PROVISIONS.

Since the services contemplated under the AGREEMENT are professional in nature, it is understood that the ENGINEER, acting as an individual, partnership, firm or legal entity, qualifies for professional status and will be governed by professional ethics in its relationship to the LPA and the DEPARTMENT. The LPA acknowledges the professional and ethical status of the ENGINEER by entering into an AGREEMENT on the basis of its qualifications and experience and determining its compensation by mutually satisfactory negotiations.

WHEREVER IN THIS AGREEMENT or attached exhibits the following terms are used, they shall be interpreted to mean:

- Regional Engineer Deputy Director, Office of Highways Project Implementation, Regional Engineer, Department of Transportation
- Resident Construction Supervisor Authorized representative of the LPA in immediate charge of the engineering details of the construction PROJECT
- In Responsible Charge Contractor A full time LPA employee authorized to administer inherently governmental PROJECT activities Company or Companies to which the construction contract was awarded

I. THE ENGINEER AGREES,

1. To perform or be responsible for the performance of the Scope of Services presented in EXHIBIT A for the LPA in connection with the proposed improvements herein before described.
2. The Classifications of the employees used in the work shall be consistent with the employee classifications and estimated staff hours. If higher-salaried personnel of the firm, including the Principal Engineer, perform services that are to be performed by lesser-salaried personnel, the wage rate billed for such services shall be commensurate with the payroll rate for the work performed.
3. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections required as a result of the ENGINEER'S error, omissions or negligent acts without additional compensation. Acceptance of work by the LPA or DEPARTMENT will not relieve the ENGINEER of the responsibility to make subsequent correction of any such errors or omissions or the responsibility for clarifying ambiguities.
4. That the ENGINEER will comply with applicable Federal laws and regulations, State of Illinois Statutes, and the local laws or ordinances of the LPA.
5. To pay its subconsultants for satisfactory performance no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment from the LPA.
6. To invoice the LPA, The ENGINEER shall submit all invoices to the LPA within three months of the completion of the work called for in the AGREEMENT or any subsequent Amendment or Supplement.
7. The ENGINEER or subconsultant shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this AGREEMENT. The ENGINEER shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR part 26 in the administration of US Department of Transportation (US DOT) assisted contract. Failure by the Engineer to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this AGREEMENT, which may result in the termination of this AGREEMENT or such other remedy as the LPA deems appropriate.
8. That none of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be sublet, assigned or transferred to any other party or parties without written consent of the LPA. The consent to sublet, assign or otherwise transfer any portion of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be construed to relieve the ENGINEER of any responsibility for the fulfillment of this AGREEMENT.
9. For Preliminary Engineering Contracts:
 - (a) To attend meetings and visit the site of the proposed improvement when requested to do so by representatives of the LPA or the DEPARTMENT, as defined in Exhibit A (Scope of Services).
 - (b) That all plans and other documents furnished by the ENGINEER pursuant to the AGREEMENT will be endorsed by the ENGINEER and affixed the ENGINEER's professional seal when such seal is required by law. Such endorsements must be made by a person, duly licensed or registered in the appropriate category by the Department of Professional Regulation of the State of Illinois. It will be the ENGINEER's responsibility to affix the proper seal as required by the Bureau of Local Roads and Streets manual published by the DEPARTMENT.
 - (c) That the ENGINEER is qualified technically and is thoroughly conversant with the design standards and policies applicable for the PROJECT; and that the ENGINEER has sufficient properly trained, organized and experienced personnel to perform the services enumerated in Exhibit A (Scope of Services).
10. That the engineering services shall include all equipment, instruments, supplies, transportation and personnel required to perform the duties of the ENGINEER in connection with this AGREEMENT (See Exhibit C).

II. THE LPA AGREES

1. To certify by execution of this AGREEMENT that the selection of the ENGINEER was performed in accordance with the Professional Services Selection Act (50 ILCS 510) (Exhibit D).
2. To furnish the ENGINEER all presently available survey data, plans, specifications, and project information.
3. To pay the ENGINEER:
 - (a) For progressive payments - Upon receipt of monthly invoices from the ENGINEER and the approval thereof by the LPA, monthly payments for the work performed shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER, such payments to be equal to the value of the partially completed work minus all previous partial payments made to the ENGINEER.
 - (b) Final payment - Upon approval of the work by the LPA but not later than 60 days after the work is completed and reports have been made and accepted by the LPA and DEPARTMENT a sum of money equal to the basic fee as determined in this AGREEMENT less the total of the amount of partial payments previously paid to the ENGINEER

shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER.

(c) For Non-Federal County Projects - (605 ILCS 5/5-409)

- (1) For progressive payments - Upon receipt of monthly invoices from the ENGINEER and the approval thereof by the LPA, monthly payments for the work performed shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER. Such payments to be equal to the value of the partially completed work in all previous partial payments made to the ENGINEER.
- (2) Final payment - Upon approval of the work by the LPA but not later than 60 days after the work is completed and reports have been made and accepted by the LPA and STATE, a sum of money equal to the basic fee as determined in the AGREEMENT less the total of the amount of partial payments previously paid to the ENGINEER shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER.

4. To pay the ENGINEER as compensation for all services rendered in accordance with the AGREEMENT on the basis of the following compensation method as discussed in 5-5.10 of the BLR Manual.

Method of Compensation:

- Percent A sum of money equal to _____ percent of the awarded contract cost of the proposed improvements as approved by the DEPARTMENT
- Lump Sum (Maximum Fee \$20,000) (For federal funds the lump sum shall be developed using Cost Plus Fixed Fee Formula).
- Specific Rate \$178,090.00

Cost plus Fixed Fee:

Total Compensation = DL + DC + OH + FF

Where:

- DL is the total Direct Labor,
- DC is the total Direct Cost,
- OH is the firm's overhead rate applied to their DL and
- FF is the Fixed Fee.

Where FF = (0.33 + R) DL + %SubDL, where R is the advertised Complexity Factor and %SubDL is 10% profit allowed on the direct labor of the subconsultants.

The Fixed Fee cannot exceed 15% of the DL + OH.

5. The recipient shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any US DOT-assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The recipient shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of US DOT-assisted contracts. The recipient's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by US DOT, is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Implementation of this program is a legal obligation and failure to carry out its terms shall be treated as violation of this AGREEMENT. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the Department may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C 3801 et seq.).

III. **IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:**

- 1. To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amount, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General, and the DEPARTMENT; the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) or any authorized representative of the federal government, and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the DEPARTMENT for the recovery of any funds paid by the DEPARTMENT under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- 2. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any all damages to property or persons out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and save harmless the LPA, the DEPARTMENT, and their officers, agents and employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
The LPA will notify the ENGINEER of any error or omission believed by the LPA to be caused by the negligence of the ENGINEER as soon as practicable after the discovery. The LPA reserves the right to take immediate action to remedy any error or omission if notification is not successful; if the ENGINEER fails to reply to a notification; or if the conditions created by the error or omission are in need of urgent correction to avoid accumulation of additional construction costs or damages to property and reasonable notice is not practicable.
- 3. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LPA upon giving notice in writing to the ENGINEER at the ENGINEER's last known post office address. Upon such termination, the ENGINEER shall cause to be delivered to the LPA all drawings, plats, surveys, reports, permits, agreements, soils and foundation analysis, provisions, specifications, partial and completed estimates and data, if any from soil survey and subsurface investigation with the understanding that all such materials becomes the property of the LPA. The LPA will be responsible for reimbursement of all eligible expenses incurred under the terms of this AGREEMENT up to the date of the written notice of termination.

4. In the event that the DEPARTMENT stops payment to the LPA, the LPA may suspend work on the project. If this agreement is suspended by the LPA for more than thirty (30) calendar days, consecutive or in aggregate, over the term of this AGREEMENT, the ENGINEER shall be compensated for all services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred prior to receipt of notice of suspension. In addition, upon the resumption of services the LPA shall compensate the ENGINEER, for expenses incurred as a result of the suspension and resumption of its services, and the ENGINEER's schedule and fees for the remainder of the project shall be equitably adjusted.
5. This AGREEMENT shall continue as an open contract and the obligations created herein shall remain in full force and effect until the completion of construction of any phase of professional services performed by others based upon the service provided herein. All obligations of the ENGINEER accepted under this AGREEMENT shall cease if construction or subsequent professional services are not commenced within 5 years after final payment by the LPA.
6. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons arising out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and have harmless the LPA, the DEPARTMENT, and their officers, employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
7. The ENGINEER and LPA certify that their respective firm or agency:
 - (a) has not employed or retained for commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee or other considerations, any firm or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) to solicit or secure this AGREEMENT,
 - (b) has not agreed, as an express or implied condition for obtaining this AGREEMENT, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out the AGREEMENT or
 - (c) has not paid, or agreed to pay any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) any fee, contribution, donation or consideration of any kind for, or in connection with, procuring or carrying out the AGREEMENT.
 - (d) that neither the ENGINEER nor the LPA is/are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency,
 - (e) has not within a three-year period preceding the AGREEMENT been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements or receiving stolen property.
 - (f) are not presently indicated for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State, or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph and
 - (g) has not within a three-year period preceding this AGREEMENT had one or more public transaction (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.

Where the ENGINEER or LPA is unable to certify to any of the above statements in this clarification, an explanation shall be attached to this AGREEMENT.

8. In the event of delays due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control of and without fault or negligence of the ENGINEER no claim for damages shall be made by either party. Termination of the AGREEMENT or adjustment of the fee for the remaining services may be requested by either party if the overall delay from the unforeseen causes prevents completion of the work within six months after the specified completion date. Examples of unforeseen causes included but are not limited to: acts of God or a public enemy; acts of the LPA, DEPARTMENT, or other approving party not resulting from the ENGINEER's unacceptable services; fire; strikes; and floods.

If delays occur due to any cause preventing compliance with the PROJECT SCHEDULE, the ENGINEER shall apply in writing to the LPA for an extension of time. If approved, the PROJECT SCHEDULE shall be revised accordingly.

9. This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (30 ILCS 580). The Drug Free Workplace Act requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purpose of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or service from the DEPARTMENT unless that grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. False certification or violation of the certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to suspension of contract on grant payments, termination of a contract or grant and debarment of the contracting or grant opportunities with the DEPARTMENT for at least one (1) year but not more than (5) years.

For the purpose of this certification, "grantee" or "Contractor" means a corporation, partnership or an entity with twenty-five (25) or more employees at the time of issuing the grant or a department, division or other unit thereof, directly responsible for the specific performance under contract or grant of \$5,000 or more from the DEPARTMENT, as defined the Act.

The contractor/grantee certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug free workplace by:

- (a) Publishing a statement:
 - (1) Notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance, including cannabis, is prohibited in the grantee's or contractor's workplace.
 - (2) Specifying actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition.
 - (3) Notifying the employee that, as a condition of employment on such contract or grant, the employee will:
 - (a) abide by the terms of the statement; and

 - (1) The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;

- (c) Providing a copy of the statement required by subparagraph (a) to each employee engaged in the performance of the contract or grant and to post the statement in a prominent place in the workplace.
- (d) Notifying the contracting, or granting agency within ten (10) days after receiving notice under part (b) of paragraph (3) of subsection (a) above from an employee or otherwise, receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- (e) Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program.
- (f) Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment and rehabilitation is required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.

Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act, the ENGINEER, LPA and the Department agree to meet the PROJECT SCHEDULE outlined in EXHIBIT B. Time is of the essence on this project and the ENGINEER's ability to meet the PROJECT SCHEDULE will be a factor in the LPA selecting the ENGINEER for future projects. The ENGINEER will submit progress reports with each invoice showing work that was completed during the last reporting period and work they expect to accomplish during the following period.

- 10. Due to the physical location of the project, certain work classifications may be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.).
- 11. For Preliminary Engineering Contracts:
 - (a) That tracing, plans, specifications, estimates, maps and other documents prepared by the ENGINEER in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be delivered to and become the property of the LPA and that basic survey notes, sketches, charts, CADD files, related electronic files, and other data prepared or obtained in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be made available, upon request to the LPA or to the DEPARTMENT, without restriction or limitation as to their use. Any re-use of these documents without the ENGINEER involvement shall be at the LPA's sole risk and will not impose liability upon the ENGINEER.
 - (b) That all reports, plans, estimates and special provisions furnished by the ENGINEER shall conform to the current Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Bureau of Local Roads and Streets Manual or any other applicable requirements of the DEPARTMENT, it being understood that all such furnished documents shall be approved by the LPA and the DEPARTMENT before final acceptance. During the performance of the engineering services herein provided for, the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the documents herein enumerated while they are in the ENGINEER's possession and any such loss or damage shall be restored at the ENGINEER's expense.

EXHIBIT A
SCOPE OF SERVICES

To perform or be responsible for the performance of the engineering services for the LPA, in connection with the PROJECT herein before described and enumerated below

The scope of services for the replacement of the Craycroft Bridge under staged construction shall be as follows:

1. **Topographic Surveys:** The horizontal and vertical control will be established for use for the topographic survey as well as aid in construction layout. A topographic survey of the land surrounding the bridge shall be performed, as well as roadway cross sections at 50' intervals for 500' on each bridge approach. Section corners shall be located and/or recovered, pictures of the site conditions during survey taken, and the survey data obtained from the field shall be downloaded/processed and a DTM created.
2. **Hydraulic Surveys:** The terrain for the hydraulic surveys is heavily wooded, so the use of GPS will not be possible and will therefore need to be total station work. Vertical and horizontal control will need established at each stream cross section of 1000' US, 500' US, 100' US, US bridge face, DS bridge face, 100' DS, 500' DS, and 1000' DS. Those cross sections shall then be surveyed with the total station, along with a streambed profile for the entire 2000' for the hydraulic analysis. Existing bridge openings of the existing structure as well as the upstream and downstream structures will be measured, as required for the hydraulic adequacy in the PBDHR. All data will be downloaded, process, and a DTM created.
3. **Permits:** Due to in-stream work, permits and coordination will be needed with the US Army Corp, IDNR Office of Water Resources, and IEPA Section 4040.
4. **Environmental Documents:** Due to in-stream work and likelihood of ROW acquisition, an Environmental Survey Request is required. All attachments for the ESR will be prepared and the online ESR form filled out and submitted to the District.
5. **Preliminary Bridge Design & Hydraulic Report:** The hydraulic analysis of the natural, existing, and proposed structure will be performed in HECRAS. That hydraulic analysis will then be inserted into the PBDHR form along with proposed structure information, and attachments required for the PBDHR submittal will also be prepared. This will conclude the Phase I portion of the project.
6. **Plans and Specifications:** Phase II of the project will include all design, plan preparation and bid docs to replace the structure under staged construction. Quantity calcs will be completed and provided to the County for aid in construction. Shop Drawings will be reviewed and approved during construction. Structure is expected to be a 3-span concrete deck on steel or precast concrete i-beams. The following are anticipated plan sheets:
 1. Cover Sheet
 - 2-7. Summary Of Quantities, Gen Notes and Typical Sections
 - 8-11 Schedule of Quantities
 - 12-13 Roadway Plan and Profile
 - 14-19 Staging Plans - Stage I & II
 - 20-21 Grading Plan
 - 22-23 Erosion Control (if needed)
 - 24-55 Structure Plans
 - 56-82 Roadway Cross Sections.
7. **Right of Way:** Due to the steep existing slopes and the anticipated profile raise, Right of Way acquisition is anticipated on this project. There are 7 parcels within the anticipated project limits, and for this engineering estimate those 7 parcels are assumed to require ROW acquisition. This work includes records research and work to establish existing ROW, preparing 7 ROW plats and legal descriptions, and any monument records needed.

- b. ~~Upon award of the contract for the improvement by the LA and its approval by the DEPARTMENT, 100 percent of the total fee due under the AGREEMENT based on the awarded contract cost, less any amounts paid under "a" above.~~

By Mutual agreement, partial payments, ~~not to exceed 90 percent of the amount earned,~~ may be made from time to time as the work progresses.

4. That, should the improvement be abandoned at any time after the ENGINEER has performed any part of the services provided for in paragraphs 1a, through 1h and prior to the completion of such services, the LA shall reimburse the ENGINEER for his actual costs plus 100 percent incurred up to the time he is notified in writing of such abandonment - "actual cost" being defined as in paragraph 2 of THE LA AGREES.



For Breach or violation of this warranty the LA shall have the right to annul this contract without liability.
