Grant Fraud, Waste, Abuse and Mismanagement

Fraud

In law, fraud is deliberate deception to secure unfair or unlawful gain, or to deprive a victim of a legal right.

Grant Recipient's Responsibilities

Federal grants are awarded to carry out specific goals and objectives. These funds are subject to certain regulations, oversight, and audit.

- 1. Grant recipients are stewards of federal funds.
- 2. Grant dollars must be used for their intended purpose.
- Where applicable, grant recipients must account for costs and justify and document expenditures

Using federal grant dollars for unjust enrichment, personal gain, or other than their intended use is a form of theft.

Individual who do so may be subject to criminal and civil prosecution under the laws of the United States.
